The images of the Saints, in the form of statues or stained glass, that you find in churches all around the world, remind us that Saints come in all different shapes and sizes: they are from different centuries, different countries and cultures: there are the young and the old; there are priests, religious and lay people, married and single. Among them are men and women who gave everything to serve the sick and the poor, a number who endured terrible cruelty and gave their lives for the love of Christ, others who served God generously in peaceful times. All of them, in the different circumstances of their lives, were people of prayer whose hearts were open to God and neighbour. Their diversity tells us that, even in the face of the greatest challenges, sanctity is for all, and possible for all.

In the Cathedral Church of Los Angeles, there are magnificent tapestries showing a great procession of Saints; they say that the artist gave the Saints the faces of local people in the city. The diverse characters among the Saints in any church also teach us that sanctity wears different faces; faces we might meet on the street, from Santa Monica Blvd. to River Valley Road. We walk among Saints every day.

A small child, looking at stained glass windows of the Saints, once said: "A saint is one who lets the Light shine through". As we celebrate the Feast of All Saints, we are reminded that we too are called to let God's Light shine through by the way we live, because we belong "in that number, when the Saints go marchin' in!"
