Anam Cara, the organisation that supports bereaved parents, is holding its next monthly Parent Evening on Wednesday 16th of November from 19:30 to 21:00 in B.A.S.E, Brackenstown Road, Swords, Co. Dublin. This event is open to all bereaved parents regardless of the age your child died, the circumstances of their death, or whether the death was recent or not.



The Year of Mercy is rapidly coming to an end – it finishes on 20th November. As a grouping of Parishes we have undertaken a number of initiatives during the year in order to mark and to celebrate it. On **Saturday November 12th** we are going to walk through the Holy Door of the Pro-Cathedral. The plan is very simple. We gather at **Gardiner Street Church at 1.00pm** and after a short prayer there we walk to Sean McDermott St Church, again a prayer and finally to the Pro-Cathedral. Whilst at the Pro-Cathedral we can review the 1916 exhibition. All three churches have ‘holy doors’ and at each church we will say a prayer as we ‘walk’ through the Holy Door. At Gardiner St. we can pray at the shrine of Fr John Sullivan whose cause for canonisation is in process in Rome. His tomb draws a daily stream of devotees, as does the monthly Mass in his memory. Fr John worked for a short time in the church in 1907. At Sean McDermott St Church, we can pray at the shrine of Venerable Matt Talbot
